

## 2018 WHITE-TAILED DEER SEASONS

**Regular Deer Season (Archery, Shotgun, and Muzzleloader):** 15 September - 31 December 2018. Crossbows are permitted on archery hunts only. Archery equipment is authorized in shotgun/muzzleloader areas. Shotguns and muzzleloaders are prohibited in archery only areas.

### Bag limits and season limits:

One (1) antlered deer per season. Antler measurements must meet definition of legal antlered deer (see definition of legal antlered deer below). Any deer with at least 3" antler length is considered an antlered deer.

Three (3) antlerless deer per day; no season limit.

Deer harvested on Fort Campbell are considered bonus for Tennessee and Kentucky license holders.

"Earn-a-Buck" remains suspended for the 2018 deer season. Hunters are not required to harvest a doe prior to harvesting a legal antlered deer. We do encourage hunters to harvest does to prevent the reimplementation of this program in future seasons.

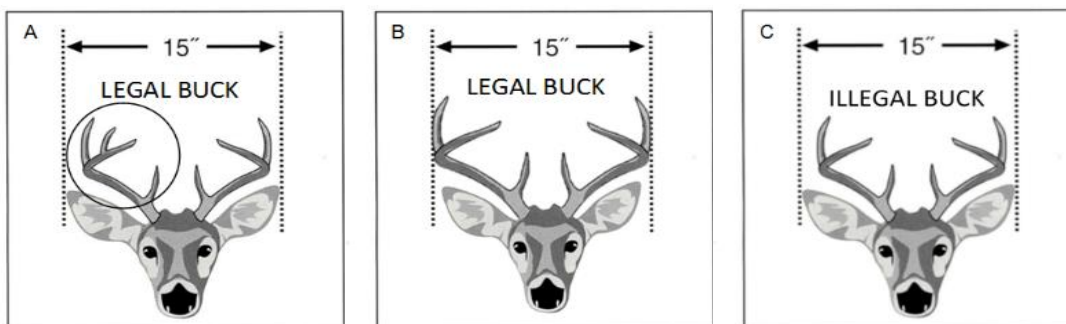
### Definition of legal antlered deer for 2018

A legal antlered deer is defined as having 4 points on one antler **OR** an outside spread of 15 inches. A point must be at least 1" long to count towards the 4 points on one side.

A buck with less than a 15 inch outside spread can be harvested **IF** that buck has at least 4 points on one antler.

A buck with less than 4 points on both antlers can be harvested **IF** that buck has an outside spread of at least 15 inches.

A 15 inch outside spread will extend just outside each ear (see photos below).



A. A buck with less than a 15 inch outside spread can be harvested IF that buck has at least 4 points on one antler.

B. A buck with less than 4 points on both antlers can be harvested IF that buck has an outside spread of at least 15 inches.

C. A buck with less than 4 points on both antlers and less than a 15 inch outside spread CANNOT be harvested on Fort Campbell.

**Harvest of any illegal buck will result in a 2 year suspension of all hunting privileges on Fort Campbell.**

## 2018-2019 WILD TURKEY SEASONS

Take of non-bearded turkeys by bow hunters on any authorized archery only deer hunt is **PROHIBITED** during 2018 Deer Season.

**2018 Fall Turkey (Archery and Shotgun; crossbows are permitted):** 7 October - 31 December 2018.

Season limit is 3 non-bearded turkeys (all may be harvested on same day). Bearded turkeys are prohibited during Fall Turkey Season.

Hunters may hunt in parties of 3 during Fall Turkey Season.

All harvested turkeys must be checked-in at Fort Campbell Fish and Wildlife's Check Station.

**2019 Spring Turkey (Archery and Shotgun; crossbows are permitted):** 23 March - 12 May 2019.

Daily bag limit is **1 bearded turkey**; **season limit is 2** bearded turkeys. Bearded is defined as having a visible beard.

Turkeys harvested on Fort Campbell are considered bonus for Tennessee and Kentucky license holders.

## 2018-2019 SMALL GAME SEASONS

**Bullfrog:** 1 June - 23 August 2019. Daily bag limit is 15. Possession limit is 30.

**Grey and Fox Squirrel:** 25 August 2018 - 28 February 2019. Daily bag limit is 10. Possession limit 20.

**Raccoon:** 1 September 2018 - 28 February 2019. Daily bag limit is 5. Possession limit is 10. Hunting parties can consist of 3 hunters. Raccoons may be harvested during any small game hunt within defined season dates and bag limits. Opossum may be taken during any authorized raccoon hunt. No daily bag limit.

**Rabbit:** 3 November 2018 - 28 February 2019. Daily bag limit is 5. Possession limit is 10. Hunting parties can consist of 4 hunters.

**Quail:** 23 November 2018 - 28 February 2019 (season length subject to abbreviation). Daily bag limit is 5. Possession limit is 10. Party limit is 10. Hunting parties can consist of 3 hunters, but combined daily bag limit is restricted to 10 per party per day. Harvest of quail outside of an area designated for quail hunting is prohibited. All hunters must bring full, intact quail to Fort Campbell's Check Station between 23 November and 31 December for biological data collection. Following 31 December, hunters will only be required to fill out hunter survey data and provide appropriate wing(s) from harvested quail.

**Coyote I:** 3 November 2018 - 17 March 2019. No daily bag limit. No season limit. Coyotes may be taken with shotgun, muzzleloader, or archery. Shot size greater than 00 Buck is prohibited. Coyotes may be taken on any authorized hunt, except raccoon hunts. Use of electronic and non-electronic calls to lure coyote are permitted only in designated coyote hunting areas. Coyotes may not be hunted at night.

**Coyote II:** 13 May - 31 May 2019. Same bag limits and restrictions as Coyote I season.

**Bobcat:** 3 November - 31 December 2018. Daily bag limit is 1. Season limit is 3. Harvested bobcats must be checked-in at Fort Campbell Fish & Wildlife's Big Game Check Station. Bobcats can be harvested on any authorized deer or coyote hunt only. Use of electronic and non-electronic calls to lure bobcats are permitted only in areas designated coyote hunting areas.

## **2018-2019 FERAL HOG REGULATIONS**

**ACTIVELY PURSUING FERAL HOGS BY ANY MEANS IS ILLEGAL ON FORT CAMPBELL. PLEASE REPORT ALL FERAL HOG SIGHTINGS TO FORT CAMPBELL FISH AND WILDLIFE: (270) 798-9854**

Feral hogs may be harvested on site during any authorized hunt (subject to change). Feral hogs must be checked-in at Fort Campbell Fish & Wildlife's Big Game Check Station.

## **2018-2019 MIGRATORY BIRD SEASONS**

**Federal laws regarding possession limits apply to all migratory birds, except Canada geese which are restricted to a possession limit of 4.**

**Dove 1:** 1 September - 28 September 2018. Opens at noon (1200) on 1 September. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**Dove 2:** 13 October - 4 November 2018. Daily bag limit is 15. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**Dove 3:** 8 December 2018 - 15 January 2019. Daily bag limit is 15. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**Early Duck I:** 8 September - 12 September 2018. Wood duck/Teal only. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**Early Duck II:** 13 September - 16 September 2018. Teal only. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**Early Canada goose:** Closed for 2018.

**\*Wilson snipe:** 14 November 2018 - 28 February 2019. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**\*Woodcock:** 17 November - 30 December 2018. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations.

**\*Crow:** Follows Tennessee's Statewide Season. Crows may be hunted/harvested in any area designated for Small Game Hunting.

**Late Waterfowl I:** 24-25 November 2018. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations with the exception of only 2 Canada geese per day. Possession limit for Canada geese is 4.

**Late Waterfowl II:** 1 December 2018 - 27 January 2019. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations with the exception of only 2 Canada geese per day. Possession limit for Canada geese is 4.

**Youth Waterfowl:** 2-3 February 2019. Bag limits follow Tennessee's Statewide Regulations with the exception of only 2 Canada geese per day (possession limit 4).

Waterfowl hunters are authorized to hunt in parties of 4.

\*Wilson snipe, woodcock, and crow may be harvested (within season dates) in any small game hunting area. Woodcock may be harvested while quail hunting.

## 2018-2019 FISHING CREEL LIMITS

Species	Minimum Length	Daily Limit	Possession Limit
Trout	None	7	14
Black Bass	See slot limit details (below)	5	10
Panfish (all species)	None	25	50
Catfish	None	10	20
Crappie	10"	10	20

**Slot Limit for Black Bass:** No Bass falling within the slot limit of 12"-15" may be harvested. Any bass caught above or below the slot limit may be harvested.
